Dear Mr. Dixon,

Boeing 747-400 VH-OJK was damaged deliberately!

The cause of the explosion that ripped a three-metre hole in the fuselage near the right wing of Boeing 747-400 VH-OJK has not been a technical problem by accident. It has been done deliberately. Before the incident occurs I had some information and I gave some parts of my information to a federal member of the Parliament and I warned him for such an attack but my report was not taken seriously by that authority and unfortunately it was ignored. Again I insisted him to take my report seriously and to do something about it to prevent the terrorist attacks, I also suggested to share the details of my information with him but I did not hear from him. I have evidence and proof for that.

As you are aware 16 years, the aircraft's age, was not old for such a plane. I agree with your comment that you do not concede Qantas has a problem, and that Qantas has a fleet of average age of about 10 years which is pretty much the world average. There are some people within the government want to hide the truth and to pretend this incident occurred accidentally because of a technical problem, and they do not care if the image of Qantas will be damaged as long as they protect their own political interests. If the MP who was warned before the incident denies that he has received my warning report I am able to prove that he has received it. Public should know that who knew about attacks in advance and did not take responsibility to prevent such a terrorist act. This is recklessness to terrorism. Public must be aware of the truth and guilty people must be brought to justice.

Dear Mr. Dixon, I am happy to share some of the details of my information with you in person. All warning reports before attacks must be taken seriously even if the Government thinks it might not be an accurate report. On 19th July this year when Qantas received a bomb threat, it put the 347 passengers and 20 crew from QF12 (flight Los Angeles-Sydney) in a hotel for the night, this shows Qantas feels responsibility and it does cancel the flight and does not put the life of its passengers at risk even if Qantas thinks the threat might be a hoax. However, it is quite strange why some politicians take the risk and put people's life in danger by ignoring the warning reports?! Police usually takes an immediate action to response a bomb scare, that's the way it should be, but some politicians ignore the warning for the attacks just because the reporter is a Muslim! Or because they don't like the reporter for her/his race or any other reasons. Does this mean that my warning was less than a bomb

scare? When Police takes action to an unknown telephone threat, shouldn't a member of the parliament response to a warning letter which contains the contact details of the writer and it's not unknown? When I wrote to the member of Parliament in Canberra and I suggested to give the details of the report for the attacks, he even did not want to hear what was the details! At least he should have replied: "OK if you really have some information about terrorist attacks I want to know about it, I like to hear what it is". He should have judged about the accuracy and authenticity of the report after and only after hearing the details, but unfortunately he jumped to the conclusion before hearing it. Is Sheikh Haron's letter of warning less important than an unknown telephone threat which turned out to be hoax? Yes, of course it is. Why? Because Sheikh Haron:

1. Is a Muslim. 2. Is a cleric. 3. Criticises the Government!

But if the reporter is a Non-Muslim or a Non-Cleric or Non-Critical one then the receiver of the report or the National Security Hot Line immediately contacts the reporter! Don't you think this is discrimination and racism? Isn't this misconduct?

According to the information I have there will be again more upcoming attacks if the Australian Government does not take my report seriously and if does not do anything to prevent it. Unfortunately some people within the Government are corrupt and this has made it more difficult for the public to receive an accurate report of some incidents' investigations, but still I believe I must not give up to announce the truth and I must have hope that one day the public will be aware of it even if some politicians do their best to hide it.
