### **Positive point in DPP, and 5 questions regarding terrorism**

Dear Sir

I sent a fax to you dated 6/08/2007 and asked a question, I have received the reply letter on the same date from Mr. Glenn Theaskston quickly. I want to appreciate you and Mr. Glenn Theaskston for quick reply. I have noticed a positive point in DPP, and that is quick reply to correspondence. This means a lot to me and shows that DPP at least cares and feels more responsibility comparing with other governmental departments.

In the reply letter 6/08/2007 Mr. Glenn Theaskston has explained that the response dated 1/08/2007 was not in any way influenced by my status or religion. Then he has mentioned that **if I request** him, DPP is willing to forward the material to the AFP on my behalf.

I think my question was not clear enough, and ... I make it more clear:

**If an Australian citizen witnesses a terrorist act in Australia and is not sure that the report to which governmental department should be sent , then instead of calling national security hot line or contacting AFP, sends the report to DPP, or post office by mistake delivers the letter of report to Immigration Minister or to the house of any Australian citizen for example, in that case :**

- 1. The receiver of the report of terrorist acts must immediately contact AFP and let them know about the terrorist act ? Or the receiver should send a letter to the sender and ask him/her to contact AFP?**
- 2. If the receiver doesn't forward the report to AFP immediately, and sends letter to sender and few days will be wasted, then in the future will court be able to charge the receiver as reckless to terrorist act's report?**
- 3. Does the receiver of terrorist act's report requires the permission from the sender? Or without permission and without request of sender must forward the report to AFP?**
- 4. Is instructing terrorist, a kind of terrorist acts in Australia?**
- 5. Can the receiver who has been reckless to the report , later says to the court that I was not sure the report was true and genuine or not, that's why I didn't forward it to AFP? If yes then if anybody receives a bomb scare call will be able to ignore it? Or must contact police?**

I appreciate if you please answer these 5 important questions. The answers to these 5 questions will guide me in the future what to do if I witness any terrorist act in Australia.

By the way please don't forget that I have reported a terrorist act to DPP dated 30/07/2007. When I receive the answer of those 5 questions I will learn more about the law and in the future if I witness any kind of terrorist act I will know what to do.

The answers of those 5 questions ( answer of each question separately) are **very important** for me and I really appreciate for your time if you reply and answer.

Regarding the subject that you mentioned in the letter that **if I request** DPP , my report will be

forwarded to AFP, I never request such thing from DPP.
