Re: Complaint from Channel 7 regarding broadcasting prohibited material on Wednesday 4th July 2007 and instructing terrorists

Dear Sir

I respectfully write to you about my complaint from Channel 7 regarding broadcasting prohibited material which was instructing terrorists directly or indirectly on Wednesday 4/07/2007 between 7 and 7.30 am in the program "Sunrise" and the subject was about Glasgow airport attack in UK, Dr. Mohammad Haneef and other doctors.

Dr. ... who is one of the regular people who is usually invited for interview to that program "Sunrise" and gives advice , has said few sentences that is classified as instructing terrorists and whatever was broadcasted from Channel 7 will cause damage and problem in Australia.

The letter of complaint from Channel 7 is attached and I respectfully request you to ask Channel 7 to give you the copy of that interview for investigation. **As an Australian citizen I expect DPP to bring Channel 7 to the justice.**

What has been broadcasted was like this story for example: A bomb explodes in a quiet train station like Seven Hills in Sydney, next day someone will be invited to the TV for interview to discuss about the matter, in the interview the person says: **"It's strange , I don't understand why they have not chosen Town Hall train station? Bomb in a quiet train station like Seven Hills kills only few people, I don't know why they have not exploded Town Hall or Central train station to be able to kill much more people? Why have they chosen this option? Not the other one?"**

There are also many other negative issues in that broadcasting material which cause serious problem for Australia and I have mentioned only few of them in my attached complaint letter.

This is clearly giving message to terrorists and directly or indirectly instructing them for their next operation to choose a better option.

In the website of Channel 7 has been mentioned that any complaint should be done within 30 days from broadcasting date, so if it's possible please request the tape of that interview as soon as possible, before the 30 days expires, in case if they keep the copy of interview in Archive for a limited time.

Dear Sir at this sensitive time that the case of Dr. Mohammad Haneef is almost closed, it is expected from Australian government to show that there is no difference between Muslims and Non Muslims when it comes to breaking the law, to prove that there is no discrimination about terrorism law, and all people will face charges if they commit any kind of terrorist actions whether they are Muslim or Non Muslim, whether it is a Mosque or a Church, whether it is an Islamic Radio station or Channel 7, whether he is Dr. Mohammad Haneef from India or Dr. ... from "Sunrise".

I wait for your reply and I hope the Australian Government takes this case serious in the future like other terrorist cases that have been taken seriously in the past. If you have any question or comments please do not hesitate to contact the writer
